



The LADC Young Lawyers Committee is governed by its Board of Directors. The Young Lawyers Committee is composed of lawyers under the age of 39 or in practice for (6) years or less.

Young Lawyers' Committee.

The Young Lawyers' Committee shall consist of not fewer than seven (7) and not more than twenty (20) members of the Association, representing all districts, appointed by the President. The Chair(s) of the Young Lawyers' Committee shall be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Young Lawyers' Committee. The Young Lawyers' Committee aspires to include members representing various levels of legal experience, with a goal of having at least two (2) members who have been in practice for three (3) or fewer years. Each member's term on the Young Lawyers' Committee shall continue until the earlier to occur of: (a) resignation; (b) removal by a majority vote of the Young Lawyers' Committee, provided such removal is approved by the Board; or (c) three (3) years after his appointment to the committee. Members appointed in the first quarter of 2016 shall be deemed to have been appointed July 1, 2015. The Chair of the Young Lawyers' Committee appointed in 2016 shall be deemed to have commenced a second term effective July 1, 2016. All other committee members shall be deemed to have been appointed on July 1 of the year of his or her appointment. There shall be no limit on the number of terms a member may serve, provided the member remains a young lawyer as defined by this section. Young lawyer shall mean an attorney member who is 39 or younger or in practice for six (6) or fewer years.

The following are the duties and responsibilities of the Young Lawyers' Committee.

1. Attend at least two LADC Seminars per year.
2. Attend at least two YL Board Meetings either by phone or in person. Meetings are typically held in conjunction with seminars.
3. When notified make every effort to participate in YL and Executive Board Meetings.
2. Agree to serve on YL sub-committees and Practice Group Committees as requested.
3. Communicate, represent and serve his or her LADC district. This includes promoting seminars, to members and non-members, and encouraging young lawyers and other district members to join Practice Groups.
6. Assist in recruiting new members, especially in his or her district.
7. Endeavor to attend the ski trip or annual meeting and promote those trips within his or her district. Committee members should request to speak at CLEs associated with the ski trip or annual meeting if required for employer approval to travel.

Awards

The Committee is responsible for soliciting and screening applications for the awards presented each year at the Board of Directors and Young Lawyers Awards Dinner.

Boot Camp

The Committee assists with the social hour in the promotion of the Young Lawyers Committee and membership to the LADC. The Committee also assists with a roundtable lunch discussion regarding relevant topics to the Boot Camp attendees.

Continuing Legal Education

The Committee works with Professors Corbett and Ciolino to plan and promote educational seminars that are useful and of particular interest to young lawyers.

The Committee supports and annually attends the Conclave on Diversity. The Committee reports findings from the seminar to the membership to help enhance knowledge and encourage understanding of diversity.

Newsletter/Communication

The Committee submits articles and communication via email regarding topics relevant to the YL membership and LADC membership at large.
